

Sonata I

Vivace

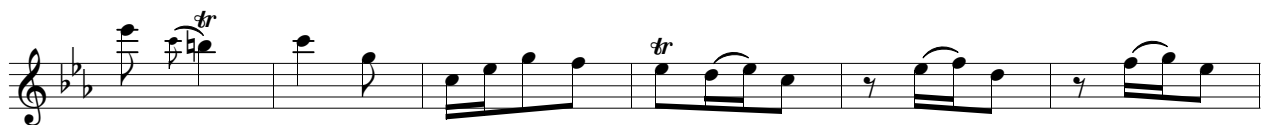
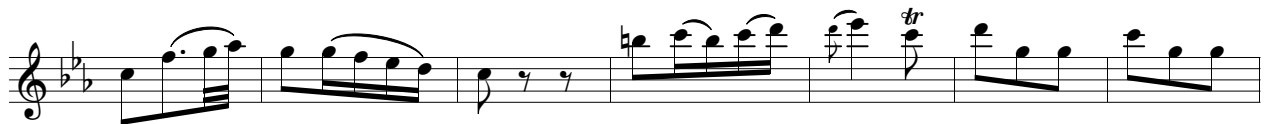
Sonata II
